RETROSPECTIVE OF THE FILMS BY MIKLÓS JANCÓSÓ (1921-2014)

The retrospective pays tribute to Miklós Jancsó, widely acclaimed, iconic Hungarian film director who became world famous with his early films on the relationship of the ordinary men and those in power.
