1956 - THE HOPE OF FREEDOM *The Hungarian Revolution*

"The people of Hungary shed blood to show the world its devotion to freedom and truth."

István Bibó, Minister of State, 4 November, 1956

The exhibition commemorates the 58th Anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution of 1956 and the 25th Anniversary of the fall of the "Iron Curtain", and Hungary becoming a democratic republic. The changes in Hungary catalyzed the political processes that led to the break-down of the communist systems in the region and the collapse of the Berlin Wall.

CLARINET / SAXOPHONE AND PIANO RECITAL *by Péter Horváth and Beáta Gincsai*

UNDER COLD STARS - SÁNDOR MÁRAI (1900 - 1989)

Lecture by Dr. Margit Köves

The literary evening will be held to commemorate Sándor Márai, the poet, playwright and novelist on his twenty-fifth death anniversary. He was primarily a prose writer, and his novels like *Embers*, *The Rebels*, *Esther's Inheritance*, *Casanova in Bolzano*, and *Potraits of a Marriage* were written in Europe between 1930 and 1942. These have been rediscovered and translated into English and many other languages. Readings from his poems, essays and novels in English, Hindi and Hungarian original will present Márai, the "Noble bourgeois" and his philosophical preoccupations.

Participation of Kákics Ensemble from Hungary

The Kákics Folk Ensemble was founded in 1997. The band is well known among the Hungarian folk music enthusiasts for its regular concerts and folk dance events. The ensemble made several tours in Ecuador, Peru, Italy, Austria, Germany, Slovakia, Sweden, and Norway with a great success. Their songs are usually accompanied by specific musical instruments of the original times, known as Hungarian peasant instruments of the old traditions.

The band has a diverse repertoire. Apart from the chants of poor young men who fled from military service, choosing the outlaws fate, the ensemble also plays the songs having contemporary and eternal words of folk traditions that permit the audience to enter the world of Hungarian peasants.
